Online Supplements to Published Papers

Beginning with Volume 55 (2008), papers published in *NRL* may, when appropriate, include supplementary material which will be published online-only and linked to the main *NRL* article abstract on Wiley InterScience. Online supplements are intended to enhance the published article; the article itself must still be self-contained and fully understandable without reference to the supplement. There is no limit to the size of online supplements.

Typical materials that can be featured in the online supplement include the following:

- Detailed proofs or derivations whose techniques might be of interest to specialists in the area but do not in and of themselves constitute the central contribution of the paper.
- Numerical results from large-scale studies when only representative results are published in the paper but the complete results are valuable to other researchers in the field for later testing or analysis.
- Additional details about a case or application described superficially in the paper.
- Algorithms that other researchers or practitioners may want to implement but whose detailed descriptions and implementation details distract from the central contribution of the paper.

Authors will be responsible for providing the supplementary material according to the specifications described below. Each online supplement will receive its own Digital Object Identifier (DOI) and will be citable accordingly.

The online supplement must be formatted as a single PDF document readable by Adobe® Reader® 5.0 or later. Note that default settings on PDF translators may save to newer versions, so be sure to check the settings. The document must be typeset as PDF, not scanned as an image.

The supplement should be presented in 12 point, Times New Roman (or close equivalent) font and single spaced.

The online supplement may contain a list of additional references, but may not contain active hyperlinks to other material or web sites.

The first page of the online supplement must contain the information and be formatted as shown below. No additional information should be given on the first page.

The Editor-in-Chief may reject an online supplement if it does not meet these requirements or if, in his judgment, the additional material does not add substantial value to the published paper or is inappropriate for publication.
